The Bermondsey Beer Mile is a stretch of artisan breweries and taprooms spanning almost a-mile-and-a-half of streets and railway arches under London's first railway. Its origins can be traced back to 2009 with the opening of the first brewery, *The Kernel*, from whence it has grown sporadically. Start at Maltby Street Market, where you can sample some good street food, and end at Fourpure Brewing Co. Opening times are limited to weekends and some adjacent evenings.
